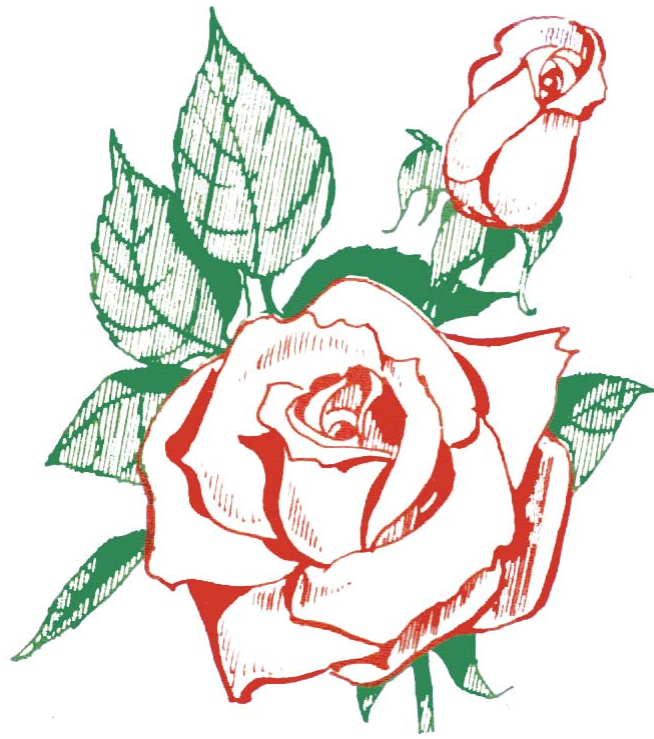

- Column 1 indicates the American Roses Society rating. These ratings are provided as a guide only; not all varieties are rated and some low rated ones are often very good garden performers.
- Column 2 indicates the observed height of the plant.
- Column 3 indicates fragrance: f = slight; ff = moderate; fff = strong.
- Column 4 gives the color
- **Newly added varieties are in bold type**

Patios and Mini Floras are essentially what the name implies; Miniature Floribundas. All these are continuous flowering, some fragrant, and are of varying bloom shapes. Climbers

Modern climbers differ from ramblers in that they are usually repeat flowering and produce fewer and thicker canes. Most varieties produce double or very double blooms in clusters while some produce single petal blooms. Fragrance, bloom shape and frequency, vigour, disease resistance and hardiness are unique to each variety. Climbing roses can be induced to produce more bloom by dead-heading.

They are mostly fragrant and blooms can be small single petal in trusses to medium-sized double blooms in clusters. Because of their ultimate size and vigour, Ramblers are excellent for pergolas, training into trees and other situations where they may be allowed to ramble.

Landscape Roses—for ground cover, bedding and borders

The varieties listed below are ideal for landscaping purposes. They are all vigorous and low growing, bloom continuously all season in clusters, require little pruning, (most) are virtually disease free, and are reliably winter hardy in USDA zone 5 (maybe 4). They are particularly attractive when used in bedding plantings as they fill the space beautifully with their spreading habit and the abundance of bloom makes a spectacular show. We have noted those varieties that have a spreading or prostrate (ground hugging) habit with a "P" after the code and have indicated the foliage & bloom size in the description to associate similar varieties. Large foliage can be considered to be about the same size as a Floribunda and small foliage is almost miniature like.

B Rosa Rugosa and Hybrids

Very winter hardy, Bdisease-resistant (those not marked †); and easy to grow. Reliable in every way, from surviving the coldest winters to providing fragrant blooms throughout the season. The majority are bushy, well clothed in leathery foliage and well armed with prickly canes. Fragrant flowers, single to double in shape open from long, pointed buds and recur reliably through the season, except where noted as *non-recurrent*. Many produce attractive orange or red hips in fall which may be used for preserves, tea, decoration etc. They also tolerate some shade.

The height listed is the observed height in our field after one full season of growth. Established plants will grow taller.

Antique and Rare Roses

We have been growing some of the cultivars listed here since 1966. Antique roses have desirable qualities; most are Bdisease-resistant and winter hardy, some have a colorful history associated with their names, and above all their fragrance. The “knock” against them is that some are non-recurrent or they dont have the range of colors of modern roses. That being said there is a romantic quality to having a beautiful, care-free plant in your garden with a perfume that has been enjoyed by gardeners for centuries.

Please note: Many of these varieties are robust growers; others are less so, which is reflected in the size of the plants. E.g. a plant of Souvenir de la Malmaison will not be as husky as one of Variegata di Bologna.

Alba

Large, vigorous, free branching, well foliated varieties that are winter hardy and shade tolerant. Colours range from white to mid pink, and the blooms are double to very double. The growth habit and intoxicating perfume assure a deserving place in the garden for these varieties.

All are non-recurrent, but bloom abundantly in the early part of the season when established.

Damask & Portland Damasks

These are usually medium sized shrubs growing to about 4-5, well foliated and upright growing though some have a tendency to arch gracefully. Most Damasks are non-recurrent but produce large fragrant blooms over a long period. As with most old roses the colour selection is limited to whites, pinks, and wine reds in varying shades. *Portland Damasks* are freely repeat flowering and as a group are dense, bushy, and upright. Blooms are carried on a short peduncle giving the appearance of being retracted into the foliage.

Planting Bare Root Roses in the Garden

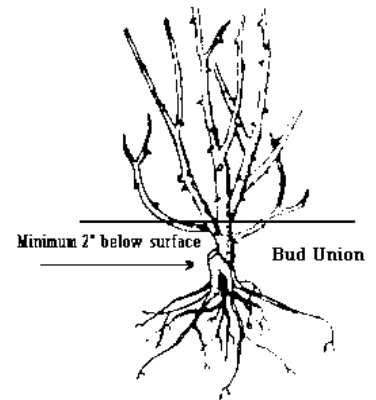
☞ *It is critical that you dont allow your bare-root plants to lay exposed for any length of time before or during planting. Always keep the roots moist and protected prior to planting.*

Before you open the bag:

- Decide where the plants are going to be planted.
- Gather the tools you need (spade, gloves, bucket of water, garden hose with water turned on, bone meal and/or plant starter fertilizer)
- Prepare the planting area by adding packaged or well-rotted manure and peat moss (or compost). Dig the holes about 18 inches deep and wide and mix in a double handful of bone meal at the bottom of the hole. **DO NOT USE GRANULAR ROSE FOOD, FRESH MANURE OR MUSHROOM COMPOST AT PLANTING TIME, IT WILL BURN THE ROOTS AND KILL THE ROSE.**

Ready to Plant:

- Place the plants in a bucket of water and take them out of the bucket separately as you plant each one. If you cant fit all the plants in the bucket, leave the remaining ones sealed in the bag in cool shade. **Dont leave the plants soaking in water for more than 8 hrs.**
- Trim 1” off the ends of the roots before you plant. Freshly trimmed roots develop new roots quicker and newly developed roots take up more nutrients than older ones.
- Trim any white, elongated shoots back to 1/8”.
- Place the rose in the hole setting the union **AT LEAST 2 INCHES BELOW THE SURFACE** of the garden. *This is imperative in colder climates (zone 6 and colder) as it affords the plant extra protection in the winter*, in warmer climates the union may be placed level with the surface. You may plant deeper if you wish. *Some of our customers in Minnesota and Manitoba plant as deep as 6 inches below the surface with great success.*
- Back fill the hole with your planting mix and compress the soil with your foot. Pack well to eliminate air pockets.
- Water the plants thoroughly with plant starter solution before back-filling completely.
- **Hill the plants up with a mound of soil about 10” high and remove in 2 weeks.** This protects the plant from drying out (desiccation) while it develops new roots. This is also suggested practice as protection for over-wintering you roses.
- Water the plants thoroughly every 2nd or 3rd day for the first 2 weeks.



Bare root rose Planting Don'ts

Don't leave roots exposed while unpacking, handling or planting. Roots will dry out and die with a few minutes of exposure.

Don't use granular rose food, fresh manure or mushroom compost when planting. These compounds WILL kill the roots and the plant.

Don't soak the roots for prolonged periods (more than 8 hrs). Store the plants in a sealed plastic bag or heal them in.

Don't plant roses in raised beds or containers that will not provide the root enough protection from freezing.

Bare root rose Planting Dos

Do use a root promoting fertilizer (high middle number). Bonemeal or plant starter work wonders.

Do water your newly planted roses regularly.

Planting Roses in Containers

To be successful planting roses in containers you need large containers and a rich, well drained potting soil. You also need to give the plants regular watering and fertilizing. We suggest you consult the internet as there are excellent instructions available that are specific to your area for growing roses in containers. **Please note that in colder climates containerized roses WILL NOT survive the winter without significant protective measures. Also note that we dont guarantee roses planted in containers.**

Shipping & Handling

Recent increases in fuel prices have translated into increased shipping costs. We have tried our utmost to keep the charges as low as possible. In the past shipping charges were based on the weight of the box. Today shipping charges are based on the weight of the box in relation to the size/ volume. The explanation goes if you are shipping 100 lbs of feathers and were shipping 100 lbs of gold (were it only the case!) you should pay more because your feathers take up more available space than our gold.

Increased security has also increased shipping costs, both to the USA and within Canada.

We reserve the right to change the below shipping rates if necessary. In such case we will notify affected customers prior to shipping.

Shipping within Canada

We use Expedited Parcel for shipping to residential addresses within Canada. For large orders we may elect to ship via courier service.

**As we use Canada Posts on-line tools to book order shipment we have the ability to review the projected time in transit. As such we sometimes elect to ship via Xpresspost if the projected time in transit is too long . In such cases higher shipping rates will apply.*

Shipping to U.S.A.

The rates quoted are for the continental U.S.A. only, Puerto Rico, Hawaii and Alaska are higher.

For shipments to the U.S.A. we use Fed Ex ground service, customs formalities are arranged through our broker, for which costs are included in the shipping rates as is the cost of inspection by Agriculture Canada and the issuance of a phytosanitary certificate. We strongly recommend "3 Day Express" service from Buffalo NY for orders traveling in January to mid-February.

NOTE: "3 Day Express" service from Buffalo doesnt include transport & handling from Port Hope; hence its 4 day Express from Port Hope.

From mid-February through the end of the season ground service shipping provides timely, reliable and reasonable service.

Please provide your phone number so we or the shipper may contact you if difficulties arise with delivery.

January and February shipping may at times be delayed if its too cold. We endeavor to contact affected customers by phone or email.

We do not ship via postal service to the U.S.A.

Overseas Parties

Please check with your Department of Agriculture as to regulations importing roses from Canada. Please provide us with a copy of your import permit when you place your order. We will quote you an approximate shipping cost for the number of plants you wish to order, including plant inspection charges by Agriculture Canada and \$1.00 per plant root-washing charge if necessary. With the exception of extra large orders, it has been our experience that Air Mail is the most efficient and cost effective way to ship orders beyond North America.

Once a phytosanitary certificate has been issued the order travels at the purchasers risk. We will not accept liability for delays in transit nor delays attributed to rejection by destination custom or agriculture departments.

GUARANTEE

We grow every plant we sell. Our bud-grafted roses are all on Rosa multiflora seedling rootstock and are noted to be virus-free.

We supply 2 year old field grown #1 grade plants, per standards defined by the American Association of Nurserymen (see our website for details), having 3 or more branches from the union (bud-graft). The size of the plant will be relative to the typical growth characteristics of the particular variety. We reserve the right to supply a lighter grade plant (having a minimum of 2 branches) at a lesser price if a variety is sold out in No.1 grade, *unless your order is marked to the contrary*. We guarantee to supply healthy, sound, true to name plants which, if planted properly and without delay will grow. Sometimes however, with living plants problems do arise. **If upon receipt you are dissatisfied with the condition of a plant please call us immediately and we will make every effort to correct the problem.** If a plant fails to grow within 3 months of receipt it will be refunded, or replaced with a future order if the fault is clearly ours; in cases of doubt at half price. If a plant proves to be untrue to name we shall replace it free or refund the price paid. Shipping and handling charges are applicable on replacements and not refundable. **We do not guarantee roses to survive the first or any winter, including fall planted orders.** Sorry, late fall weather is too unpredictable for us to take responsibility for newly planted roses.

PACKING & SHIPPING

We have been shipping bare root roses for over 40 years. Once an order is assembled it is kept in refrigerated storage until shipping. Orders are then double bagged, sealed and packed in corrugated boxes. We do not use any packing material such as damp newspaper or moss. We believe excessive moisture or foreign matter in the sealed bag can promote disease. Our packing method is quite adequate to sustain the viability of the plants for a considerable time. We reserve the right to ship by the most practical and expeditious way possible. "3 day" delivery is not possible due to the border crossing and should be considered **3 days from Buffalo N.Y.** The plants are inspected by Agriculture Canada, and a phytosanitary certificate is issued prior to shipping. Costs for this are included in our "Shipping & Handling" charge. ***The ship date indicated on your order is the date it is scheduled to depart from Port Hope.*** We endeavor to ship every Tuesday (last Tuesday in October through to the 3rd Tuesday in November & from January through May) to facilitate arrival of your order by Friday of the same week. ***If your order doesnt arrive by Friday DON'T WORRY; the plants are packed in a manner to ensure their viability for some time.*** While we can not assume responsibility for delays in transit we need to be notified if your order doesnt arrive in a timely manner or in good condition.

Pick-up orders. Please give us ample time to prepare your order. A 50% deposit is required with your order; the balance to be paid at pick-up time. **Our deadline for pick-up is May 31.** If an order is not picked up by then, it will be considered cancelled; any deposit received will be retained.

BUSINESS TERMS

This catalogue cancels all previous issues. Prices are quoted for bare-root plants, and are effective through May 31, 2010.

The minimum order to be delivered to any address is 3 plants, also for pick up.

Placing your order. You may place your order by phone, fax, mail and through our website. *Fall orders must be in our possession by Sept. 30.* Our deadline for spring shipping is the 2nd Tuesday of May; to meet that date, ***orders must be in our possession no later than May 1,*** especially for non-Canadian destinations, which require inspection by Agriculture Canada. For US customers picking up their order requiring individual inspection, costs will be added to the invoice. Spring orders will be confirmed beginning in November in order of receipt. Additions to orders will be invoiced as new orders with shipping and handling applicable, but we will endeavor to send all your plants in the same shipment to lessen the shipping charges.

Changes to your order. Previously we have tried to accommodate as much as possible with regards to additions, deletions, substitutions and delivery date changes. In spite of our best efforts this has resulted in costly delays and confusion and ultimately disappointment.

AS SUCH WE CAN NO LONGER MAKE ANY CHANGES TO AN ORDER ONCE IT HAS BEEN PLACED.

We will continue to try our best to combine multiple orders into one shipment to save on charges and will of course correct any errors made on our part.

Before placing your order PLEASE be certain of your choices and the date you wish to receive your order.

Substitutions. It's inevitable that, as the season progresses, some varieties will be sold out, or be unavailable at shipping time due to unforeseen circumstances. Therefore, we prefer you to list your own choice of substitutes. Unless you do so, and if you do not instruct us otherwise, we will supply a smaller plant (defined above) at a lesser price, or select the closest possible substitute. Refunds will be made where necessary.

Terms and conditions. A credit card number or deposit is required with all orders and payment in full is required prior to shipping. Payment can be made by cheque, money order or Visa/MasterCard. Cheques or money orders will be cashed when the order is confirmed or when the cheque is received, in the case of payments made after confirmation (Sorry no post-dated cheques). Credit card orders will be billed when your order is assembled. Orders which are not paid in full at shipping time are subject to adjustment; the number of plants may be reduced at our discretion according to payment received. Cancelled orders are subject to a 10% service charge, minimum \$10.00. ***U.S. orders are payable in U.S. funds.***
